BROWNIES across the world took part in The Great Big Sleepover to try and break two Guinness World Records.

On June 16 from 5.30pm until 9am on June 17 brownies in Argyll and Bute, all over the UK and even further afield will be taking part in an attempt to break the world record for the biggest simultaneous sleepover and the most people simultaneously brushing their teeth. The current record for teeth brushing is 10,240 people and was set in China. The night also acts as a fundraiser for the Childline charity which is raising money to pay for the costs of the hundreds of phone calls they receive everyday.

The sleepover is trying to beat its previous record of last year, where 33,000 children took part in 2006 from as far away as New Delhi.

The theme to go along with the worldwide sleepover is Going Green, the idea is to raise the children's awareness of the carbon footprint and teach them about how to cut down their carbon emissions.
